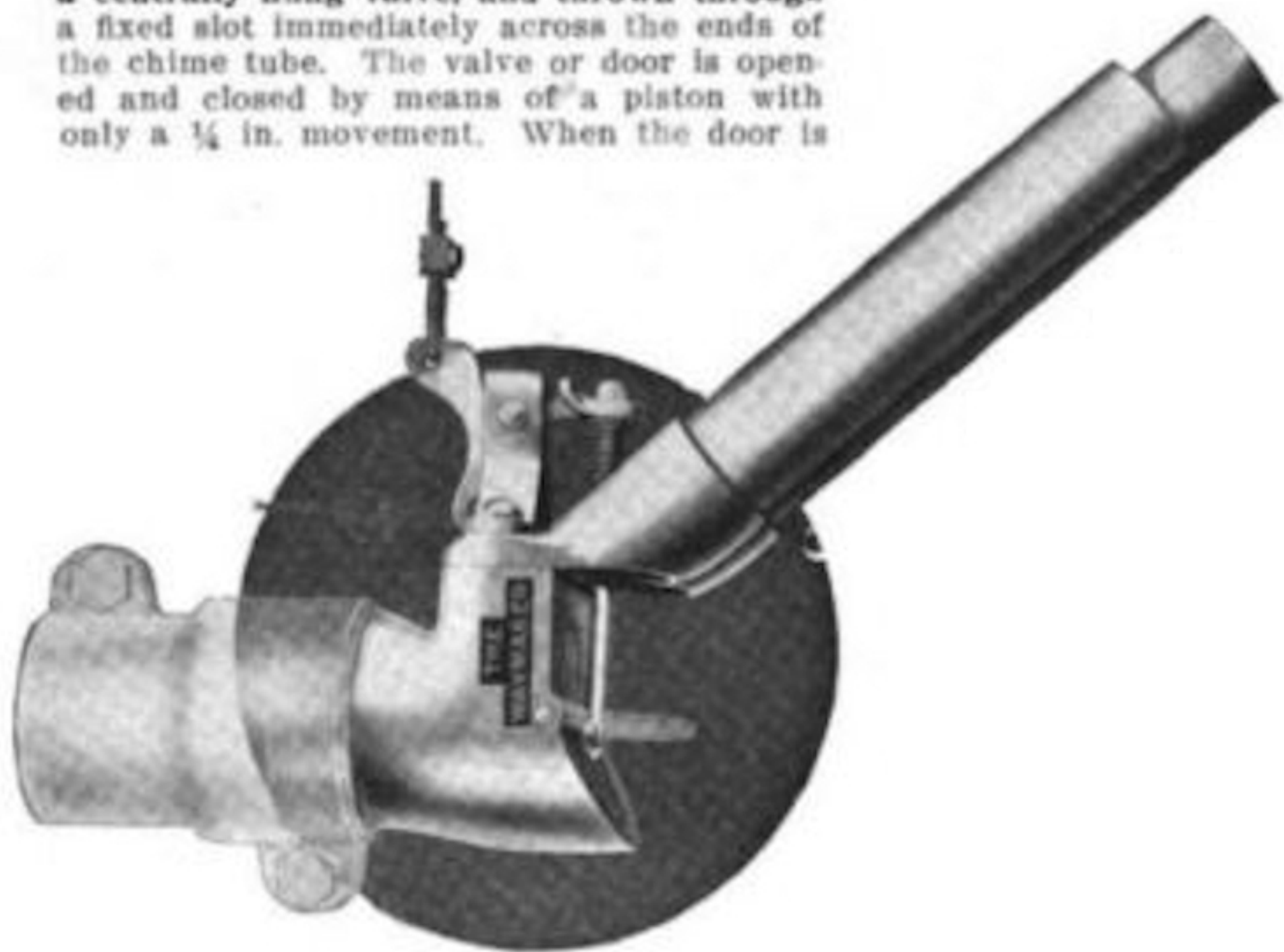


THE "WAYMAKER" EXHAUST HORN

The Lee Tire and Rubber Company, Conshohocken, Pa., has recently placed on the market a new double-toned exhaust horn, known as the "Waymaker."

This horn has both foot and hand control. The exhaust gases are deflected by a centrally hung valve, and thrown through a fixed slot immediately across the ends of the chime tube. The valve or door is opened and closed by means of a piston with only a $\frac{1}{4}$ in. movement. When the door is

open no gas can possibly reach the sound chambers and produce that annoying "humming" which often characterizes exhaust horns; nor does it make the exhaust noisy.

The tones produced are deep and harmonious, but the warning is imperative, and at the same time does not create confusion or hostility.
